

Been Locked Up? Don't Be Locked Out!

If you've been convicted of a FELONY...

you *temporarily* lose your right to vote.

BUT you automatically get your rights back in NC after you serve your sentence, including probation and parole. You do not need a special document that says your rights are restored. You just register and vote like any other citizen! (See back.) Failure to pay restitution does not block your right to vote.

**{ Your VOTE is
your VOICE }**
USE IT!

If you've been convicted of a MISDEMEANOR...

you *never* lose your right to vote.

You can register and vote, even if you are still in jail. Register to vote (see back), and then complete and mail an absentee ballot request form (available at demnc.co/absform) so it arrives at your county Board of Elections at least a week before the election.

Provide an address on your registration form (and absentee request) where you will receive mail – either the jail, your home, or someone who accepts mail for you.
